CIOR/CIOMR SUMMER CONGRESS 2019 (SC19) TALLINN, ESTONIA

INTRODUCTION

Under the CIOR and CIOMR Executive Councils, the 2019 Summer Congress (SC19) will be held in Tallinn, Estonia. This annual gathering will contribute to the continuing purpose of CIOR/CIOMR by forging links between reserve officers, sharing best practices, developing viewpoints on reserve issues in support of the NATO alliance, and fostering reserve officer professional development.

These instructions will serve as a general guide to all participants of the various committees, working groups, and activities occurring at the SC19. This instruction is not intended to provide detailed information about the various committees' working sessions, workshops, the symposium, the Young Reserve Officers Workshop (YROW), the Language Academy (CLA), the Civil-Military Cooperation Exercise (CIMEX) or the Military Competition (MILCOMP). That detailed information may be requested from the various officials associated with those activities.





PRACTICAL INFORMATION ABOUT ESTONIA



The climate in Estonia is temperate, characterized by warm summers and fairly severe winters. The weather is often breezy and humid due to the proximity of the Baltic Sea. Average temperatures range from + 20C in summer (July is the hottest month) to -8C in winter. Although occasionally the temperatures may rise to more than +30C in summer or sink below -30C in winter, it is very unusual at our latitude.

Official language is Estonian which belongs to the Finno-Ugric language group. English, Finnish and Russian are widely spoken.

Estonia is in the Eastern European Time Zone: GMT +2 hours.

The local currency is EURO. Major credits cards are accepted at hotels, restaurants, shops and all banks.

Calls to Estonia: the country code for Estonia is +372. Calls from Estonia: Calls from Estonia: Dial OO + the country code + area code + the subscriber's number.

Estonia is a part of the Schengen visa zone. Nationals of the European Union (EU), the European Economic Area (EEA) and any third-country national holding a residence permit of a Schengen State do not need a visa to enter Estonia. The required travel document for entry is a national ID card or passport.

Department stores and shopping centres are open between 9.00 and 21.00 from Monday to Sunday. Smaller shops are usually open from 10.00 until 19.00 on weekdays and on weekends.

The electricity supply in Estonia is 220 volts AC, 50 Hz. European-style 2-pin plugs are in use.

As a general rule, free WIFI Internet access is available in all Estonian accommodation establishments and educational institutions.


GENERAL INFORMATION ABOUT Sc19

Congress activities will be conducted at one main location - Tallinn, Estonia, will be the site of committee working sessions, workshops, the symposium, the CLA, the CIMEX and the major ceremonial and social activities, as well as the MILCOMP. The Committees' working sessions, workshops and the Symposium will generally operate in a self-sufficient manner under the overall direction of the Executive Council in accordance with the Master Events List, available on SC19 website www.cior.erok.ee

ADMINISTRATIVE AND LOGISTICAL SUPPORT

Participants are to carefully consider the following information when making personal preparations. Further information can be obtained by contacting congress organisers as required.

- 1 Air travellers should arrive at Tallinn International Airport (TLL). The Airports Council International (ACI) recognised Tallinn Airport with the Best European Airport 2018 award. Airport bus and tram stops are located at the city side of the passenger terminal. Single journey tickets can be bought from the driver and cost 2 €. The journey to the city centre takes approximately 15-17 minutes. A Taxi stand is also just outside the departure hall. The fare from the airport to the city centre is about €5 to €10. Google Maps is handy helper when needed, UBER and Bolt are also available.
- **2** Ferries arrive directly to the Tallinn Harbour Passenger Terminal, which are located in the city centre and 10min walking distance from the SC19 hotel area. Ferries cross the Gulf of Finland between Tallinn and Helsinki several times a day, covering the distance in roughly 2 to 3 hours. Ferries between Tallinn and Stockholm depart every evening, with the trip taking approximately 15 hours.



Departure. As with arrival, CLA, CIMEX and MILCOMP participants must provide their departure information during registration. All other participants leaving downtown Tallinn must coordinate their own transport to the appropriate departure venue.

IMPORTANT - The host nation will provide transportation from and to Tallinn International Airport and Tallinn Harbor Passenger Terminal only for CLA, CIMEX and MILCOMP registered participants who are accommodated in the Estonian Academy of Security Sciences (EASS). All other participants heading to downtown Tallinn will have to coordinate their own transport.

3 - The hotels that host the working sessions of the CIOR, CIOMR, YROW and SYMPOSIUM are located close to one another in the city center. Participants will confirm their arrival and receive a SC19 identification card at registration desk prior to the opening ceremony. Short-Term Guests, Speakers and other members who are not formal participants are not required to report to a reception desk. They are to contact their sponsor for reporting information.

IMPORTANT - EROA main reception desk is located at the Radisson BLU Sky Hotel Conference Center. Look for signage or ask facility staff.

SC19 BADGES

Participants must carry their identification badges with them at all times. The badge will allow access to congress events and areas. Guests are responsible for the security of their own belongings.

DRESS

Opening Ceremony. Class A service uniform. This includes a jacket, tie and medals. It does not include higher-order ceremonial items such as swords. This is an appropriate walking-out dress.

Routine Activities – Tallinn. Class A service uniform or short sleeved collared shirt with ribbons, no tie. This is an appropriate walking-out dress. Combat uniform will be used only for participating on VP Shooting Competition and Milcomp visit.

President's and Gala Dinners. Military mess dress. These include a formal dinner jacket with bow tie, ceremonial trousers, dress, or kilt. If a participant does not possess a formal dinner jacket and ceremonial trousers, service dress with white shirt, bow tie, and ribbons on the jacket is appropriate. This is an appropriate walking-out dress.


Swissotel Tallinn

CIOR/CIOMR SC19 VP SHOOTING COMPETITION

8 AUG 2019 VP participants are invited to take place SC19 VP SHOOTING COMPETITION. The aim of this event is to introduce the SC19 participants Defence League Männiku Shooting Range, where during the SC19 the MILCOMP event took place. Also is a great opportunity for delegates to practice military skills in friendly environment.

Registration must be made in the CIOR Council meeting room no later than 6 AUG at 14.00. No more than three representatives from the official delegation of each participating country (maximum 60 participants), led by national VP or ASG.

Competition:

Consists from two different shooting disciplines (same as MILCOMP).

- Rifle 7,62 mm: 200m prone, 5 shots training (5min), 9 shots competition (5min) and rapid fire 9 shots (1min). The rifle belt allowed.
- Duty Pistol 9mm: 25m, 5 shots training (3min), 4+5 shots competition (5+5min) and rapid fire 9 shots (35sec).

Rifle and pistol will be shot to electronic targets. Ear and eye protection will be provided. Use BDU or comfortable civil clothes.

Awarding (medal of special edition):

- 3 best of rifle,
- 3 best of pistol,
- 3 best overall.

Transport from Radisson SKY Blu will be provided at 15.00 Transport back to the hotel will be provided after the end of the competition.
